ELECTION SKEPTICISM:

While the vast majority of Midterm voters believe that THEIR vote was accurately counted, there are still MANY who do not have confidence in the election process.

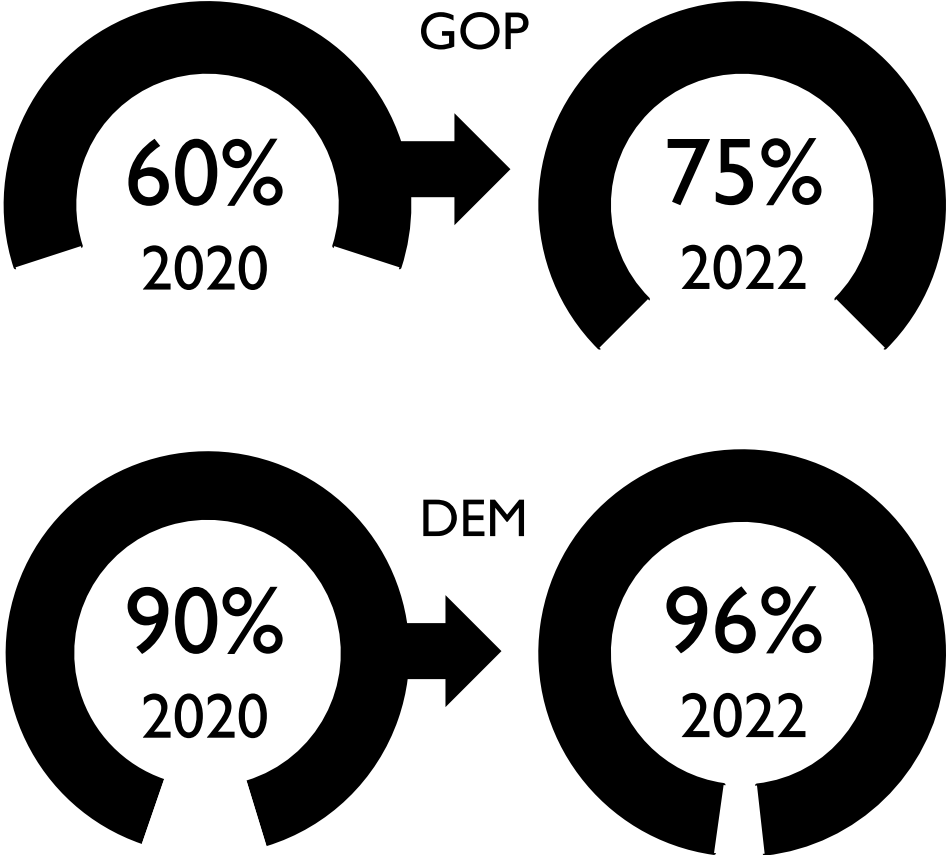
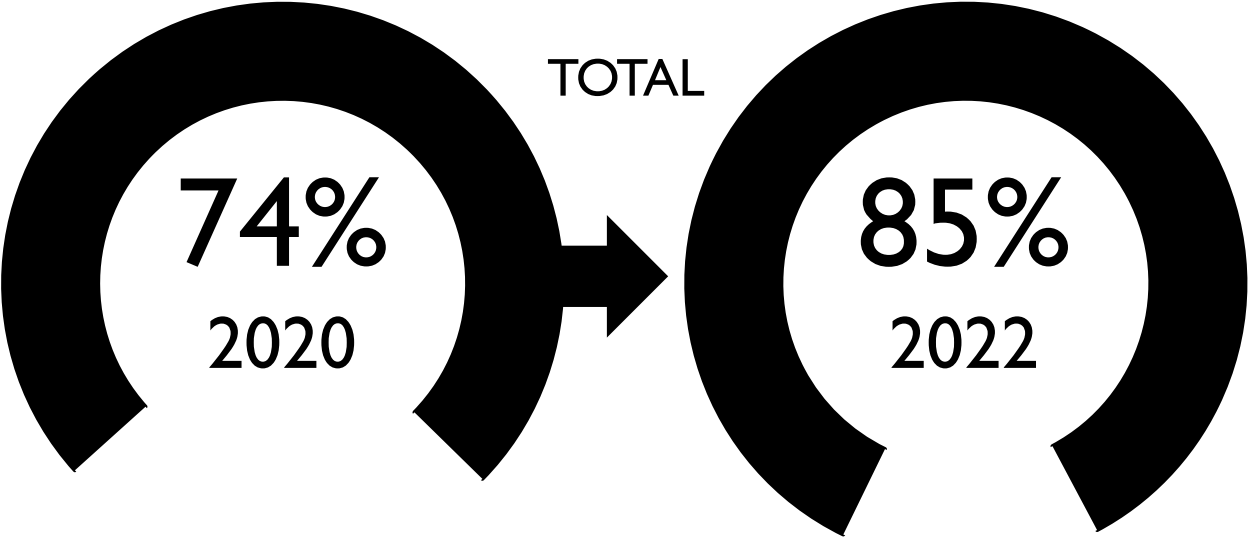
The majority of Midterm voters who identify as Republican do not have trust in our overall election process. And that distrust has increased over the last year.



TRUST IN INDIVIDUAL VOTE INTEGRITY HAS RISEN BY ABOUT 10%.

*In 2022, 85% of voters believe their vote was accurately recorded and counted. The same measure was 74% in 2020.
Trust in elections jumped by 15% for Republicans between 2020 and 2022.*

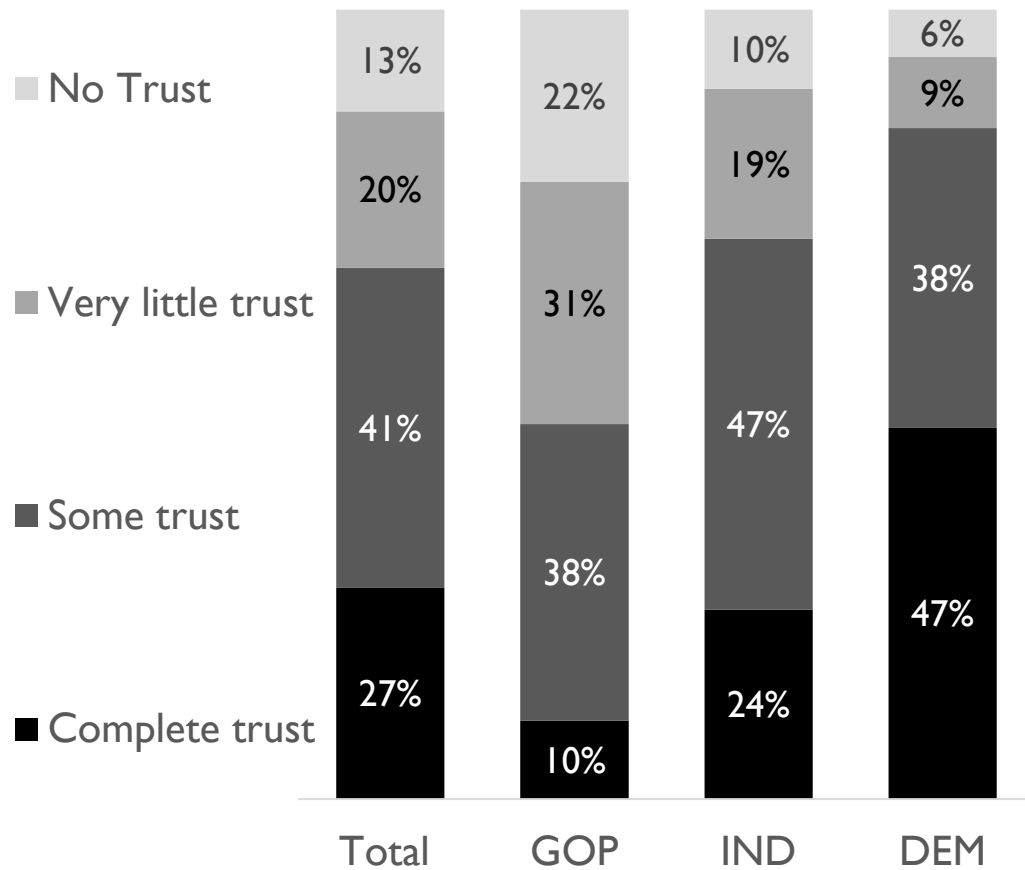
*QUESTION: Do you believe your vote was accurately recorded?

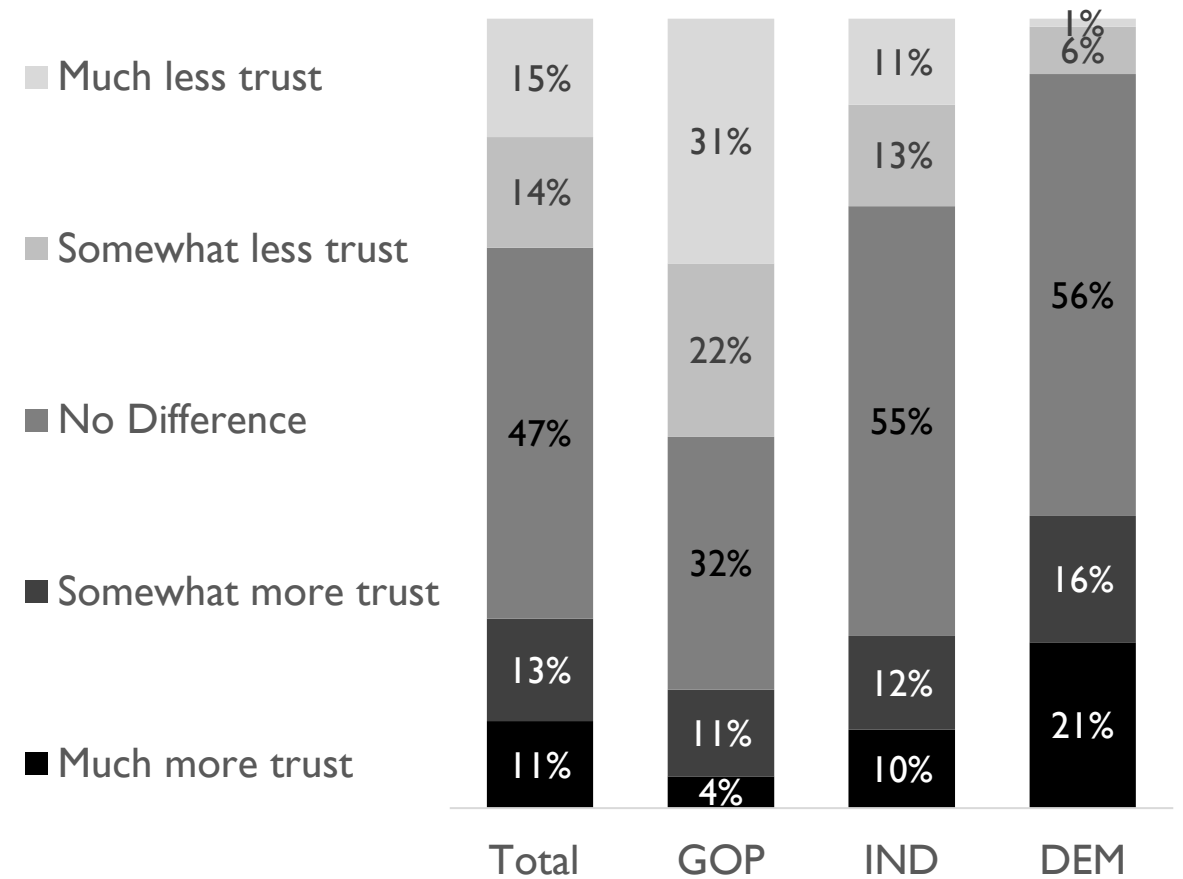
MANY REPUBLICANS (53%) DO NOT TRUST OUR ELECTION PROCESS.

And for the majority of Republican Midterm voters, that distrust has been growing for the last two years.

QUESTION: Please indicate your general, gut reaction level of TRUST in our election process.



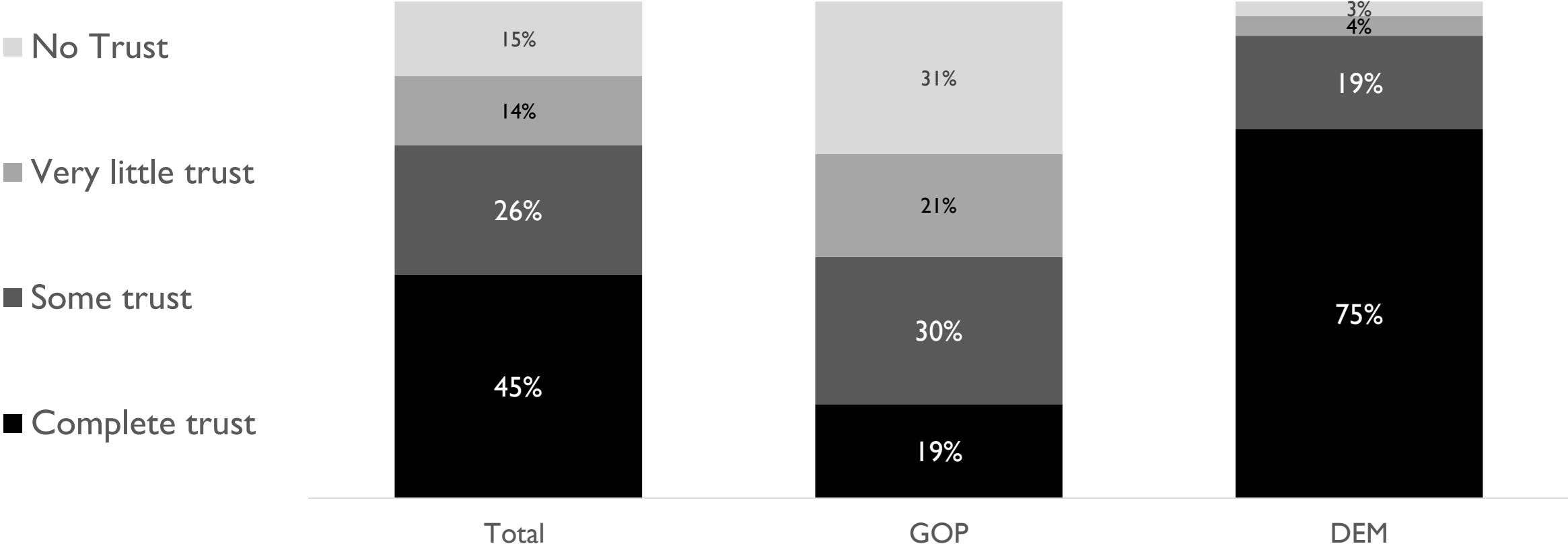
QUESTION: Do you find you have more trust or less trust in elections since the 2020 Presidential Election?



2020 SKEPTICISM REMAINS.

More than half of Midterm voters who identify as Republican have 'no' or 'very little' trust that the 2020 Presidential election was accurate. Compare this to only 7% of Midterm voters who identify as Democratic who feel the same way.

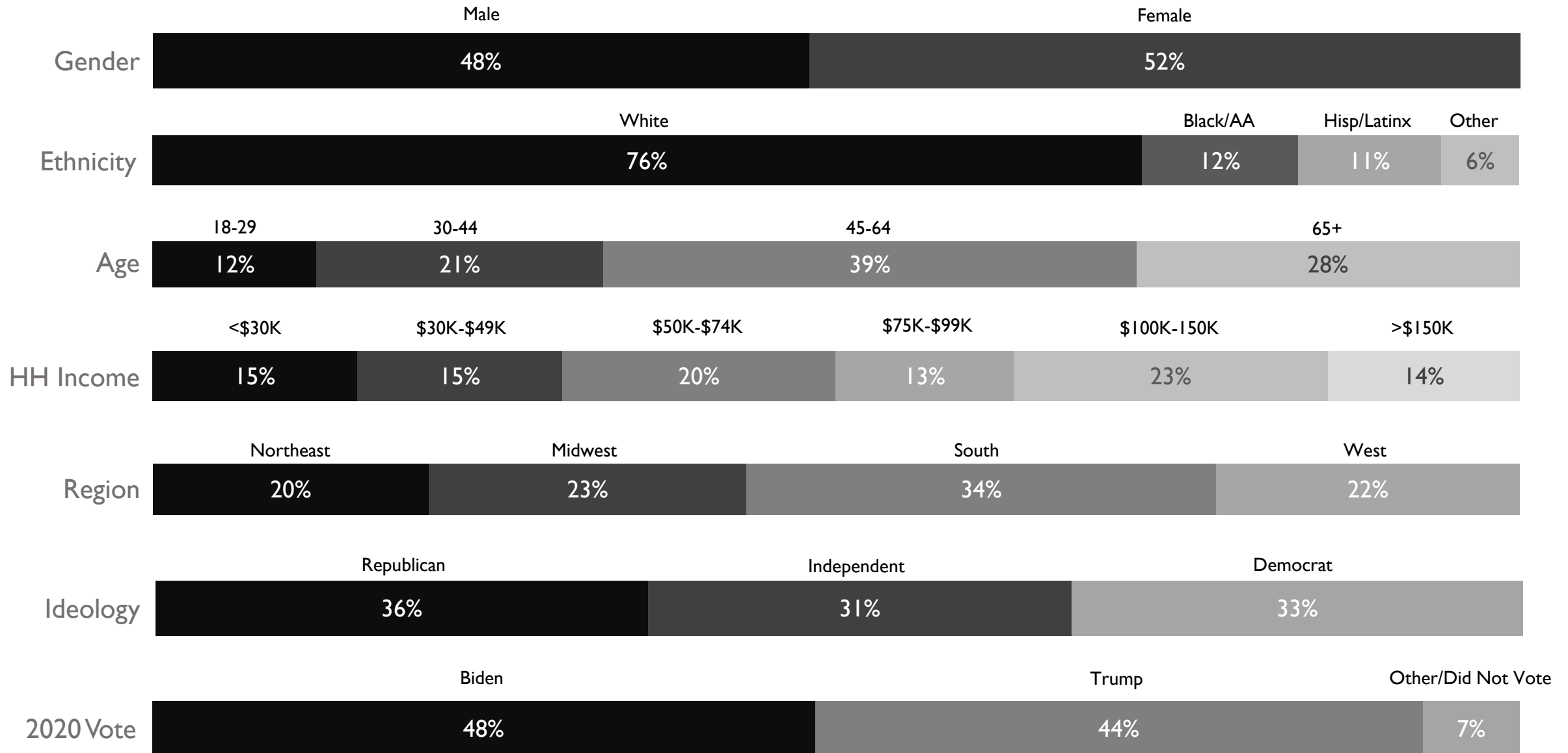
QUESTION: How much trust do you have that the 2020 Presidential election recorded and counted votes accurately?
